WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type: Trium Avala Dynamic Equity Fund (the "Fund") is a sub-fund of Trium UCITS Platform plc, an open-ended investment company with variable capital structured as an umbrella fund with segregated liability between sub-funds which is registered in Ireland and authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland as a UCITS under the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011, as amended. Segregated liability between sub-funds means that the assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law. The prospectus and periodic reports are prepared for Trium UCITS Platform plc at umbrella level. You may switch your shares in the Fund to shares in other sub-funds in which you are eligible to invest. Further information is available from the administrator, Northern Trust International Fund Administration Services (Ireland) Limited.

Objectives: The Fund's investment objective is to seek to achieve positive returns over the medium term (3 years), independent of market conditions. The Investment Manager intends to invest in equity and equity-related securities of companies which the Investment Manager believes have been mispriced by the market. The Investment Manager uses proprietary (to the Investment Manager) equity models as part of its stock selection process focusing on; Fundamental Models (which includes historical information such as share price and earnings) and Statistical Arbitrage (such as profiting from share price dislocations over the periods from 1 day to 2 months) that has been honed over 20 years. Portfolio construction is highly disciplined and diversified. The Fund will aim to achieve such diversification by trading a large portfolio of long and short positions across a number of industry sectors focusing on large and mid-cap companies. The Fund may invest in FDI (i) for investment purposes, (ii) to attempt to hedge some of its investment risk, or (iii) for the purposes of efficient portfolio management. An FDI is a contract between two or more parties whose value depends on the rise and fall of the underlying asset. The Fund's use of FDI may introduce leverage into the Fund, which may result in losses that are greater than the original amount invested. The Fund may also, for cash management purposes, invest in fixed-income instruments (including sovereign, corporate or government bonds which may be fixed or floating, investment grade as rated by a recognised credit rating agency). The Fund is actively managed without reference to any benchmark meaning that the Investment Manager has full discretion over the composition of the Fund's portfolio, subject to the stated investment objectives and policies.

Any income less expenses that the Fund generates for this share class will be accumulated and reinvested to grow the value of your investment. Shareholders may redeem shares on any business day (any day on which banks are normally open for business in Dublin, and London).

Hedging: The shares are denominated in Euro (EUR) and the base currency of the Fund is Euro (EUR). Therefore, there is no currency hedging for the EUR class. Other share classes that are not denominated in the base currency are hedged.

Intended Retail Investors: An investment in the Fund is suitable for investors seeking capital appreciation and that are prepared to accept a moderate to high level of volatility. Investors should be prepared to maintain a long-term investment in the Fund. Investors should be prepared to bear losses.

Term: The Fund has no maturity date. The Management Company is not entitled to terminate the Fund unilaterally nor can the Fund be automatically terminated.

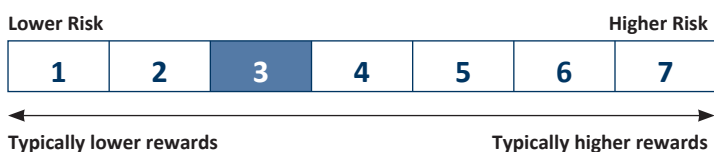

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

RISK INDICATOR

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 3 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early. WHAT HAPPENS IF TRIUM IRELAND LTD IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

COSTS OVER TIME
